Disease here now called Influenza.
there is a good many cases at
Breward and several at Cherry field
Several more of the Boys have
got their war papers. Joe Lance
Rufus Barton Frank Turner & Odd
Bryson. a lot of the people here
thinks the war will soon end and
I hope and Trust it will. a crowd
of us girls went up on Kirkendoll
Creek a chestnut Hunting last
Thursday. we sure had a nice
time only wish you could have
ben with us. we did not get many
Chestnuts, but had lots of fun.
Last monday night the
Tannoy at Rosman was

Burned down. Uncle John
Southorn is right Bad sick.
I had a letter from Bertha
Friday she was asking about
you. Geneva is at Home now.
her school has has stopped
two weeks on account of the
Influenza. I guess you will
have a Brother-in-law by the
time you get home. Chester
is still at Camp Severe. Bud
is still at Augusta Ga.
Ola is doing a lot better
since ma Ledbetter come up

to see her. all the people
around Selica are as jolly
as ever. I hope you will
always Remember you have
